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
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Words from our Founding Principal Terry Senior

- Our youngest students have been involved in costume design and learning superhero dance moves







INTERNATIONAL MIDDLE YEARS CURRICULUM (IMYC)



The Middle School students (grades 6-8) at The Hamilton International School will follow the International Middle Years Curriculum (IMYC). IMYC is the first curriculum that really addresses and supports the learning journey of 11-14 age students. It is specifically designed around the needs of the developing adolescent brain.

IMYC is a challenging, internationally minded and concept-focused curriculum, which helps develop engaged and active learners. With specific subject and personal learning goals, it provides a clear structure to develop knowledge, skills and understanding whilst making subject learning more connected.

The education offered in the Hamilton Middle School builds on the students' previous learning and knowledge from their elementary years. Our teaching pedagogy and combination of subjects ensure that we provide Amazing Learning which is challenging, engaging and connected that High School students find relevant and inspiring.

Learning is based around themes, or 'Big Ideas', on topics such as Identity, Balance, Discovery, Renewal. These 'Big Ideas' are applied in the wide range of subjects we offer students. Students cover six Big Ideas per year. Throughout the year, the students will create different projects across all sections and subjects, which will provide them with deeper insight and understanding as part of the holistic education provided by the school.

At Hamilton, it is our vision to ignite students' passion and to help prepare them for the adult world and make them more independent and self-aware. Students are introduced to a wide subject content and are encouraged to learn and think for themselves. The following subjects are taught at the Middle Years: English Language, Arabic as first Language, Mathematics, Science, Social Sciences (Humanities), Foreign Languages (Arabic, French, Spanish), Design Technology, Islamic Studies, Qatar History, Performing Arts, Music and Physical Education.
