

#### PARENT & STUDENT TECHNOLOGY TOOLS

#### ClassDojo

ClassDojo connects teachers with students and parents to build amazing classroom communities. ClassDojo includes the links to live lessons and a summary of the daily learning with the applicable assignments. There is also the Student Portfolio which allows each student to upload work for all subjects. This is a tool for modes of learning: in-person and distance learning so please ensure ClassDojo is checked daily by students and parents. It also contains important communications from our senior leadership team. If you do not have login details for ClassDojo, please contact your child's homeroom teacher for assistance.

#### **Engage**

Engage is a tool THIS utilizes as a parent portal, which contains student information. Engage is where all school reports, invoices, events and announcements are located. 
