



MoEHE Compulsory Subjects

The Hamilton International School pays great attention to MoEHE Compulsory Subjects (Arabic language, Islamic Studies, and Qatar History), due to their importance in promoting national and cultural identity, in addition to instilling human principles and values through teaching these subjects. The teaching of compulsory subjects is based on MoEHE's plans and resources. Therefore, the school has allocated an appropriate number of hours for the compulsory subjects in accordance with the Qatari curriculum.

The Arabic and Islamic Studies Department also organizes curricular and extracurricular activities, in addition to providing the opportunity for all students to participate in external competitions, including, for example: ISP Holy Quran Competition, ISP Spelling Competition, and ISP Reading Competition, the Little Muhaddith Competition, and the Reading Olympiad Competition organized by MoEHE and the Future Writers Competition with the Qatar Charity and other competitions.








Prayer Time

The Prayer time is considered one of the fundamental and important aspects in the lives of Muslims because it is the second pillar of Islam that Muslims are required to perform at specific times. 




SAFEGUARDING





Early Years Curriculum

Our Early Years comprises Pre-KG and KGI. The children in Early Years are offered amazing learning opportunities through The Hamilton Early Years Thematic Curriculum, a play-based curriculum which celebrates the uniqueness of every child. This curriculum is bespoken to Hamilton and facilitates holistic development, encouraging independence and interdependence, communication, enquiry and healthy living and physical well-being. The Hamilton Early Years Thematic Curriculum introduces exciting units that allow the children to build skills and share their knowledge of the world around them. These units are used as a springboard as we follow the interests of the children to see where their learning can take them. Children lead their own personal inquiries through play. The Hamilton Early Years Curriculum is complimented by discreet learning opportunities for Phonics, English and Arabic and Islamic. The children also receive Music, Languages and Physical Education sessions. Children will also develop tech skills through using a wide range of resources exploring cause and effect as well as coding.

Learning Happens Everywhere...

As learning develops, our passionate teachers introduce resources to engage the children. In Early Years, children have access to Shared Learning Areas which act as an extension to the classroom and are developed alongside the children's interests and unit of learning. These areas help children develop their gross motor skills. Each of our Early Years classrooms are filled with play-based, purposeful learning provision including small world, creative, role play, construction, fine motor, mark-making, and number resources. Our classrooms open up to a range of exciting, play based areas, including: a a learning garden, playground, a shared area, picnic area and a small field.



Primary Curriculum

Our curriculum is exciting, personalized and student-centered. Our objectives are designed to meet the American Core Standards in Maths and English and are enriched by other curricula to ensure your child is equipped to succeed in their international educational journey.

In addition, our International Primary Curriculum (IPC) (which covers our Foundation subjects), our specialist provision and our world-class teachers and facilities, support students to receive the very best international learning experience.

We are a true international community, comprising of over 80 nationalities. Our community works together to ensure our students develop holistically.

At Hamilton, we appreciate that all students are on their own learning journey. We place great emphasis on base line assessments across our subjects. This enables our teachers to plan for the individual needs of each student to help them to reach their true potential.

Maths

In Primary, we follow the Concrete, Pictorial, Abstract approach to bring Maths to life for our students. It is system of learning that uses physical and visual aids to build understanding around abstract topics. Our students are introduced to a new mathematical concept through the use of concrete resources and when ready, are given pictorial representations of the concrete objects they have been using. They are then asked to solve problems where they only have the abstract i.e., numbers or symbols. This approach ensure depth of understanding and builds connections across the Maths curriculum.

English

Our English lessons are fun, engaging and challenging. Students explore a variety of genres, where they experience writing for a different audience and purpose. Our students begin each genre with a 'Small Write' so we can assess their starting point. Our units follow an 'Immerse, Analyse and Write' approach, which enables students to be engrossed in all aspects of the genre. Each unit culminates in a 'Big Write', an opportunity student's have to apply what they have learned to an independent piece of writing. Within each unit, we immerse ourselves in spelling, punctuation and grammar activities to equip them with the skills they require. We want to instill a passion for reading across our curriculum. Students will explore a range of fiction and non-fiction texts through dedicated guided reading lessons, phonics lessons (Read Write Inc), comprehension lessons and weekly library opportunities. We understand that to be an effective reader and writer, you must be a good speaker and listener and develop skills of oracy, therefore we develop learning environments which foster confident speakers and listeners across a variety of contexts.



IPC

The Hamilton Thematic Curriculum is a comprehensive, creative curriculum with a clear learning process for the foundation subjects and science. Each unit of work is designed for one core purpose: improving students' learning. These cross-curricular units are based around themes to help children make sense of the world they live in, nurture their personal qualities, and develop a sense of international-mindedness. Throughout each topic, students explore a range of subjects and personal learning goals. The subject learning goals cover the knowledge, skills and understanding that the students will develop and are the foundation on which the thematic units are built. The eight personal learning goals underpin each unit to represent the attributes that we believe children will find essential in the continually changing context of their lives.

Specialists Subjects

Our students are fortunate to be taught by specialist teachers who are experts in their field. Languages (French or Spanish), PE, Swimming, Music and ICT are all taught weekly by subject teachers, which enables students to experience 'amazing learning' across these areas.

Arabic and Islamic Studies

Arabic and Islamic studies are taught by Arabic specialists. Arabic lessons take place over the week in line with MOEHE requirements. Qatar History is taught weekly by both mainstream and Arabic teachers. During these sessions, students who do not participate are immersed in additional English and Maths activities based on the topic they are currently learning about.

THIS SKILLS and Assemblies

This SKILLS is a unique program for our Hamilton students. These sessions enable our children to delve deeper into their own personal interests. From baking and song writing, to debating and engineering, these sessions (which run alongside our values assemblies) are designed to complement and enhance our curriculum.

Assessment

Assessment at Hamilton is purposeful and personal to ensure that our teachers know the starting points of every child. It is central to everything that we do at Hamilton, informing planning and next steps in learning. For our summative assessment, our students carry our MAP assessments three times per year which measures their academic progress. More information regarding Primary assessments can be found in our assessment policy available on the website.

Homework

In Primary, homework is allocated to students on a Thursday and handed in on a Tuesday, with the aim to support students in consolidating the learning that has taken place that week. Homework comprises of an English and Maths focus, with supplementary IPC activities where required. In addition, students are encouraged to read for 20 minutes per evening. HOMEWORK IS OPTIONAL.

Secondary School

At The Hamilton International School, our students follow a broad and balanced international curriculum that has been skillfully mapped to the American Common Core Standards.

Middle School, Grades 6,7 and 8

Each area of study is designed to build on the knowledge, skills and understanding acquired in the primary years. Students will experience exciting new learning opportunities across the curriculum with subject-specialist teachers, including: Science, Social Studies, Languages, Computer Science, Performing Arts, PE and Design Technology.

High School, Grades 9 to 12

Students study for the American High School Diploma from Grades 9 to 12. This rigorous academic platform prepares students academically and holistically for the next step in their learning journeys. Designed specifically for international students, the curriculum is broad, balanced, responsive to a student's needs and equips the child with subject knowledge, critical skills, and first-hand learning experiences.

Preparing children for the future, wherever they go in the world the curriculum is multi-dimensional and tackles real-world problems in the classroom to make these more relevant and meaningful. It fosters authentic and engaging learning experiences.

Aligned with the principles of the Qatar National Vision 2030, the emphasis is on collaboration, inquiry, investigation, reflection and learning to draw conclusions under the guidance of the teacher.

To deliver a quality learning experience, we offer a range of mandatory and elective subjects to equip our students with the knowledge and skills needed for higher education courses. We offer MAP assessments to measure progress and prepare our students for college readiness tests, including SAT examinations. The curriculum for each subject is sub-divided into units. Each unit helps build the foundation of a strong personal and conceptual understanding of the subject knowledge and skills fundamental to meeting the learning objectives and standards.

The international curriculum creates opportunities to connect learning and develop a personal perspective, work with peers, take risks in a safe environment, and helps students to become confident, independent, and engaged learners.

The necessary academic rigor and transferable skills gained under the curriculum will prepare students for future pathways in the Higher Education.



IB Diploma Programme

The International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme (IB DP) is a two-year qualification and is recognized worldwide as a rigorous pre-university course.


Full IB Diploma Programme and IB Courses

In Grade II, students may choose to take individual IB courses or become a candidate for the full IB Diploma which consists of taking six IB DP courses (three at Standard Level (SL) and three at Higher Level (HL)) and the IB Core programme.

All IB subjects are a two-year commitment, and all students in IB courses are expected to sit the external examination at the end of Grade 12. Students who complete IBDP Grade 11 are expected to remain in the course for Grade 12 and sit the exam.

The decision of whether to pursue the full IB DP or individual IB DP courses is one that should be discussed with the IB Coordinator, homeroom teacher, counsellor, and parents. Entry requirements are in place for all courses.





Inclusion at Hamilton

At Hamilton, we celebrate the uniqueness of each of our students and aim to identify and support their needs.

Gifted & Talented Program:

Gifted students are those who perform, or have the capability to perform, at higher levels compared to other children of the same age, experience, and environment. At Hamilton, we ensure that these students are provided with ample opportunities to reach their full potential. Students are identified through assessment results and teacher observations.

English as an Additional Language (EAL):

Our English as an Additional Language Program (EAL) provides support for students new to the English Language. We welcome students with various levels of English and support their integration into an English-speaking environment so they feel comfortable at our school. Our EAL specialists work alongside teachers to help EAL learners develop confidence, skills and knowledge to access the curriculum.

Intervention Program:

As an inclusive mainstream school, we have in place a 3 tiered approach to meet the needs of our students.

Hamilton HUB and Early Intervention classes - Highest level of support offering a modified Curriculum Individual learning plans with therapeutic support. Our smaller class sizes support students to progress at their pace.

Intervention classes - A hybrid approach to meeting our students at their point of need. Aimed at developing independence in a structured setting supported by therapeutic interventions plus an IEP.

Students in Intervention are timetabled in both the Mainstream & Inclusion.

On site Therapy Team - Our onsite team of therapists consists of Occupational therapists & Speech and Language therapists who work alongside teaching staff to support a student's learning journey.





Jewellery, Hair Accessories, Make-Up and Nail Varnish

A single set of small ear stude are permitted for female students.

No other jewellery should not be worn at any time by students. This includes necklaces, rings, bracelets, anklets, sunglasses, nose piercings or anything else deemed jewellery.

For health and safety reasons, students are required to remove any items of jewellery during PE lessons. Students are advised not to wear earrings on PE days.

For female students with recently pierced ears (within six weeks), students are advised to cover this area with a plaster supplied from home.

Students who are unable to remove their own earrings must not wear jewellery on PE days as teachers are not permitted to remove earrings.

A wristwatch may be worn by students; however, the school will not be held responsible for any damage or loss to the item. Smart watches are allowed but Bluetooth should be disabled during the school day.

White, black or navy-blue headwear in Primary, and black or navy-blue headwear in Secondary, headbands, hair ties, and small bows are allowed as hair accessories. Hair bands should also be in blue or white and should not have large flowers or objects attached. Extreme hairstyles are not permitted for school. Students should minimize the use of styling products and avoid decorative patterns cut into their hair, as well as coloring or dyeing their hair.

Female Secondary School students are allowed to wear light touch makeup (foundation and concealer only). Nail varnish is not permitted at school.

SPECIAL EVENTS & CELEBRATIONS

Special celebrations and events such as International Day are times when food contributes to a sense of celebration and sharing, the school will notify you ahead of time. On these occasions, foods other than those usually promoted may be offered, provided that these foods do not contain nuts. Should any food that is brought into school contain nuts, these foods will be returned to you and not eaten or distributed.

BIRTHDAYS (FOR PRIMARY AND INCLUSION)

We understand that Birthdays can be particularly important times for our young learners. We look forward to celebrating with your child, if you wish for us to do so. When it is your child's birthday, you are welcome to bring cupcakes or chocolate-covered fruit into school to share with their classmates, provided these do not contain nuts. We believe these moments can be very special for your child if they wish to celebrate. We politely ask that additional food is not brought in. Although gestures are fully appreciated, many parents may not want their child to have extra food brought in and our students may have specific allergies / dietary requirements that the parents are not aware of. Please let your child's class teacher know if you would like your child to not receive a cupcake. If this is the case, please speak with your child about the reasons behind this so they do not think the teacher is excluding them.



School Behavior Expectations

A calm, orderly, and caring environment is essential if students are to learn effectively. It is the responsibility of our school to provide this environment so that students and teachers can use time effectively. All staff encourage and model the highest standards and are very supportive in helping students achieve self-discipline. Behavior expectations are consistent throughout the school with all members of Hamilton staff at all times of the day. This consistent approach is achieved by all adults modeling polite, inclusive, and positive behavior toward students and other adults.

We place great emphasis on praising our students for politeness and kindness to others. We find that children are naturally well-behaved with praise, kindness, and encouragement.

As part of our Class Dojo and ISAMS system, students who show exceptional or improved behavior are rewarded with Dojo, house points or rewards points, certificates, and other rewards.

The student code of conduct states our expectations of student appearance and behavior on the school premises.

At The Hamilton International School, the 3C's underpin these high standards of excellence:

- Care for ourselves
- Care for others
- · Care for our environment

Students do not require a mobile phone or smartwatch to aid their learning unless directed by the class teacher. If a child comes to school with their phone, it must be kept in their bag for the entirety of the day, and they are responsible for this. If a student brings a mobile phone and uses it inappropriately, then the behavior policy will be enforced.

ATTANDENCE AND PUNCTUALITY

At THIS, we stress the importance of regular attendance and punctuality to enhance learning and student growth. Frequent absences can hinder academic progress and limit social interactions, while even a 10-minute daily lateness can equate to a week of missed learning annually and disrupt others.

Please inform the school in advance by emailing the class or homeroom teacher if a student will be absent. For absences longer than one day due to illness, a medical letter is required. If prior notice isn't given, a letter explaining the absence must be submitted on the student's return day to avoid an unauthorized absence record.

Leave requests are considered by the Head of Primary, Head of Secondary, or Head of Inclusion.

Absence and lateness are reported to parents daily through the iSAMS Parent App, which notifies parents of lateness.

We are dedicated to partnering with parents to ensure optimal attendance and punctuality, helping students fully benefit from their educational experience.

STUDENT LEADERSHIP

Student leadership plays an important role in developing well-rounded young adults. The art of building relationships within teams or groups, defining identities, and achieving tasks effectively is an essential part of student growth. Student leadership also provides an opportunity to learn to identify and display effective communication and interpersonal skills.

There are many opportunities for students to participate in activities to develop their leadership skills including House captains and vice captains, as well as a student council representative for every class.

STUDENT COUNCIL

The aim of the Student Council is to lead developments across the school and represent the student body. The Student Council consists of representatives from Grade I to Grade I2. They work the leadership team and assist in making decisions for the School.

In Secondary school we have a Middle School Student Council and a High School Student Council. The Middle School Council is comprised of representatives from each homeroom, voted in by their class peers. In High School, students go through a more rigorous process and apply to stand for various position through an application form, students vote and panel interview.

Student Council members represent the student body, encouraging student voice and choice. They also welcome special guests to our school, support at school events, and plan and organize special activities for our students.

Our school council have been key in making whole school changes, such as reducing the use of plastic in the canteen, and worked within the community through beach clean ups.

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PARENT INVOLVEMENT

At The Hamilton International School, we firmly believe that a strong partnership among parents, teachers, and students enhances the overall success of our students. We recognize that children learn best and have richer experiences when the entire school community collaborates effectively. To promote this spirit of collaboration, we have established three key committees: Advisory Board, Parent Council, and Friends of Hamilton.

I. Advisory Board (AB)

The Advisory Board serves as a key strategic body that contributes to the school's overall development and effectiveness. The Advisory Board is responsible for:

- · Acting as critical friends by reviewing and supporting ongoing improvements in the school's performance.
- Offering advice and support to the school's leadership team.
- Meeting at least twice per year to discuss various aspects of the school's operation, including previous meeting minutes, self-evaluation frameworks, calendar and community activities and projects.

2. Parent Council

The Parent Council plays a vital role in school life. The primary responsibilities of the Parent Council include:

- · Support in organizing school events.

ADMINISTRATION OF MEDICATION

Prescribed medicines:

Medicines should only be brought to the school when essential; that is, where it would be detrimental to a child's health if the medicine were not administered during the school day. The school nurse will only administer medicines prescribed by a doctor or dentist. Medicines will only be accepted in the original container as dispensed by a pharmacist and should include the prescriber's instructions for administration.

Non-prescription medicines:

As per the Ministry of Public Health, the school First Aid Unit is unable to administer medicines that have not been prescribed by a doctor or dentist. We are unable to give children aspirin or medicines containing ibuprofen unless prescribed by a doctor.

EMERGENCY PROCEDURES

In the case of an emergency, the school will call an ambulance and contact the parents. When conditions require immediate emergency treatment, first-aid trained staff may volunteer to administer emergency procedures such as resuscitation. The school never takes children to hospital in personal owned cars - it is safer to call an ambulance. A member of staff will accompany a child taken to hospital by ambulance and stay until the parent arrives.

STAY AT HOME IF UNWELL

Parents are asked to keep children at home if they show any of the following cold or flu like symptoms:

- A fever >37.5 degrees Celsius
- · Body ache or fatigue
- · Shortness of breath
- Diarrhea and Nausea
- · Loss of sense of smell or taste

ISAMS Parent Portal and Application

The Hamilton International School uses cloud-based secure software to manage the data we hold for each student. The system we use is called iSAMS. The iSAMS platform offers a new and modern web browser, Parent Portal, along with an App available for Android and iOS devices. Through iSAMS, you will have easy access to the information below:




Class Dojo - The app allows daily informal communication between parents and the class teacher.
